INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide Shareholders with information in connection with the proposals at the AGM to (i) grant the Directors general mandates to issue Shares and repurchase Shares; (ii) re-elect the retiring Directors; and to give you notice of the AGM.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE SHARES AND REPURCHASE SHARES

The Issue Mandate

At the AGM, ordinary resolutions will be proposed to (i) grant a general mandate to the Directors to allot, issue and deal with new Shares up to 20% of the entire issued share capital of the Company as at the date of resolution to provide flexibility for the Company to raise fund by issue of new Shares efficiently and (ii) subject to the grant of the Issue Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate, increase the aggregate nominal amount of the number of Shares which may be allotted and issued by the Directors under the Issue Mandate by an amount equivalent to the nominal amount of the number of Shares repurchased by the Company under the Repurchase Mandate. As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were in issue an aggregate of 400,000,000 Shares. Exercise in full of the Issue Mandate, on the basis that no further Shares will be issued or repurchased prior to the date of the AGM, could accordingly result in up to 80,000,000 Shares being issued by the Company under the Issue Mandate. The Issue Mandate shall remain in force until the earliest of (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Articles or any applicable laws of Cayman Islands to be held; and (iii) the revocation or variation of the authority given by the Shareholders by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

The Repurchase Mandate

At the forthcoming AGM, an ordinary resolution, which if passed, will grant the Directors a general and unconditional mandate to repurchase Shares with an aggregate nominal amount up to a maximum of 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of resolution at any time during the period ended on the earliest of (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Articles or any applicable laws of Cayman Islands to be held; and (iii) the revocation or variation of the authority given by the Shareholders by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

An explanatory statement to provide relevant information in respect of the Repurchase Mandate is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

Pursuant to Article 83(3) of the Articles, any Director appointed by the Board to fill a casual vacancy shall hold office until the first general meeting of Shareholders after his appointment and be subject to re-election at such meeting. Mr. Lee Shu Sum Sam, Mr. Kow Chee Seng and Mr. Chan Hoi Kuen Matthew were appointed on 14 June 2017 and are therefore shall retire at the forthcoming AGM.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

Pursuant to Article 84 of the Articles, at each annual general meeting, one-third of the Directors for the time being (or if their number is not three or in a multiple of three, then the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire from office by rotation. Details of procedures for conducting a poll are set out in the Appendix III to this circular.

This is an explanatory statement required by the Stock Exchange to be presented to Shareholders concerning the Repurchase Mandate proposed to be granted to the Directors.

1. LISTING RULES FOR REPURCHASES OF SHARES

The Listing Rules permit companies with a primary listing on the Stock Exchange to repurchase their shares on the Stock Exchange subject to certain restrictions.

The Listing Rules provide that all proposed repurchases of shares by a company with a primary listing on the Stock Exchange must be approved by shareholders in advance by an ordinary resolution, either by way of a general mandate to the directors or by a specific approval of a particular transaction and that the shares to be repurchased must be fully paid up.

2. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Any repurchases will be made out of funds which are legally available for such purpose in accordance with the memorandum of association and the Articles and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands. The Cayman Islands laws provide that the amount of capital repaid in connection with a share repurchase may only be paid out of either the profits that would otherwise be available for distribution by way of dividend or the proceeds of a new issue of shares made for such purpose. The amount of premium payable on redemption may only be paid out of either the profit that would otherwise be available for distribution by way of dividend or out of share premium of the Company. Under the Cayman Islands laws, the repurchased shares will remain part of the authorised but unissued share capital of the Company.

If the Repurchase Mandate is exercised, the Directors intend to apply the profits that would otherwise be available for distribution by way of dividend for any purchase of its Shares. There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited financial statements contained in the annual report of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2017) in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or on its gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

3. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 400,000,000 Shares.

Subject to the passing of the resolution no. 4(B) as set out in the AGM Notice and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the AGM, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 40,000,000 Shares (representing 10% of the issued share capital of the Company) during the period from the date of the passing of the resolution no. 4(B) as set out in the AGM Notice up to (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Articles or the applicable laws of Cayman Islands to be held; or (iii) the revocation or variation of the authority given by the Shareholders by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting, whichever occurs first.

4. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

6. UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that they will exercise the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules, the memorandum of association and the Articles and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

Save as disclosed above, the Board is not aware of any other matters in relation to the re-election of Mr. Lee that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders of the Company nor is there any information which is required to be disclosed pursuant to Rules 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules.

2. Mr. Kwan Kah Yew

Mr. Kwan Kah Yew, aged 49, is an executive Director and is responsible for formulating overall business development strategy and planning, overseeing the Group's performance and financial management.

Mr. Kwan worked in various accounting firms as audit staff during the period between January 1994 and July 1998 responsible of reviewing and preparing the consolidated accounts and fund flow statements.
